To Be Christians in Existing Environments

It is essential that Christians reach out into their own individual environments (I Corinthians 7:20). In Via de Cristo, people are inspired occasionally to enter the pastoral ministry; but that is never the goal.

The goal is to send participants back into their original environments as leavening agents. As a little yeast leavens the whole loaf (Matthew 13:33), so we become the yeast for Christ. For Christ we are salt to the world. For Christ we are the light on the hill (Matthew 5:13). Jesus used many parables to express his intention to use us to carry the Gospel into the world for him. We truly believe this is the work of the entire Christian Church, not professional evangelists.

Far too often Christians withdraw into carefully selected circles of likethinking individuals. They no longer take occasion to talk with anyone outside these circles. They avoid spending time with the lost. Many believers, when away from their selected circles, are careful to avoid religious talk; often out of fear, maybe out of misdirected respect. Sadly, Christ-followers can go to work and no one recognizes any difference between them and non-Christians. Within Via de Cristo we share tools that enable people to honor their Lord and share their friendship with Jesus in any environment.

Jesus will make a difference in every environment; in our homes, in our work places, with our families and in our churches. We use the structure and tools given to us through Via de Cristo to submit to the Holy Spirit's work. Once an old pastor wisely said to a young farmer, "I'm impressed with your work! I remember this farm before God brought you in as his partner!" The farmer contributes nothing to the productivity of the farm except his willingness to gain knowledge, remove obstacles, give to seeds the best environment possible, and a personal commitment to diligent aood work.

In summary, Via de Cristo is both a movement and a method. The purpose of the movement is to form within the Church small groups of committed leaders that will evangelize their environments with the Gospel. Via de Cristo purpose is to provide a workable structure that helps leaders live what is fundamental to being a Christian by committing themselves to the means of grace in Word and Sacrament, to small group dynamics and to personal growth through Piety, Study and Apostolic Action. In Via de Cristo we have found that a person using the method will:

- Experience more joy, happiness, and satisfaction from their Christian faith
- 2) Experience a closer walk with Jesus Christ
- Develop a more joyous fellowship with brother and sister Christians
- 4) Find sharing faith with others easier and more enjoyable **†**

a phone number, so I called it & spoke to the woman on the other end for a while, telling her of my interest & asking if this meeting was something I would want to attend. was Pr. Bud Miller, who was to be Spiritual Director at the Fall Women's Weekend and the "woman on the phone" turned out to be Jan Pfannes, the Rectora for that weekend. Even though Pr. Miller didn't know me very well, he signed my application & Jan had never met me, she sponsored me to attend, sight unseen! This was truly my weekend to attend, & God got me there by this convoluted path, changing the rest of my life, for which I am forever grateful.

After The Weekend . . . Living Your Fourth Day

You may attend a Via de Cristo weekend only once in your life, but you are asked to build on it for the rest of your life. Via de Cristo is not a retreat, or a substitute for a retreat. Via de Cristo does not end when the weekend ends.

After you have attended a Via de Cristo weekend, you are considered to be living your Fourth Day -- the rest of your life. After attending your weekend, you are asked to do two things in your Fourth Day:

- Expand your inner spiritual life through study and church participation, and
- (2) Become a more active witness for Christ in your daily life.

An effective Fourth Day is the fulfillment of the Via de Cristo method. It is the tree that produces the fruit. **†**

Via de Cristo offers two ongoing means of perseverance:

<u>Ultreya -</u>

Meetings of the local community for encouragement, fellowship, and study.

Reunion Groups -

Small groups of men or women who meet regularly for a short period to help one another in their quest for spiritual development.

Participation in these two groups is a voluntary part of Via de Cristo and is strongly encouraged.

Palanca, Palanca, and more Palanca

Palanca is sacrificial prayer. This sacrificial prayer can take many forms in doing a part of helping with any GNVDC Weekend. You can help with any of these ways to show the Participants that many are praying and caring about them during their 3 day Weekend.

One of the best ways to do Palanca is to sign up to pray for one or more 30 minutes segments during the 72 hours that any GNVDC Weekend is going on. You can sign up at www.3dayol.org. Go to Prayer Vigil. Find Good News! Via de Cristo. You can then click on the date of either the Men's or Women's Weekend. You can then click on the time slot that you would like to sign up for. You are asked to give your name, city, state, and country. This information is used to make up a Prayer Banner that is presented to the Participants by the Team on Friday afternoon during the "Grace In Action" Rollo. Each time slot has name of the person praying for the Weekend on one sheet of colored paper. Each paper is taped together to make a long banner. This is displayed around the Rollo Room for the rest of the Weekend. The Participants can visually see that Prayer surrounds them the entire 72 hours of their Weekend. For those that do not have computer access, you can get someone else to sign up for you, sign up on a hard copy available at Ultreyas and Team Meetings. You can also call Karen at (517) 546-1509.

Another way you can show Participants that you are praying for them, is to send a note or letter to the Weekend. The Participants are given large envelopes with notes/ letters from the Team, Sponsors, their family members, and the GNVDC Community. These notes/letters can be brought to Send-off and/ or Serenade. I have had some snail mailed to me and delivered to the weekend: 5633 E. Grand River Ave, Howell, MI 48843.

You can send small trinkets that can be given to Participants during the Weekend. These are given to the Participants on their beds, at meals



in Dining Room, or at tables in Rollo Room. Sometimes these trinkets are given by individuals, sometimes they are given by Reunion Groups.

You can also help with food donations and/or Dining Room table decorations. You can sign up to donate food through the website: gnvdc.org or contact Kitchen Chairs, Alan & Lynn McGowan.

These are some ideas about how you can pray and encourage the Participants on the Weekend. Remember how special all of these gifts of love and the knowledge that so many were praying for you was for you as a Participant. Remember you can participate in giving of Palanca whether you are working the Weekend or not. You are an important part of the GNVDC Community!

"Finally brethren, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things"

A number of years ago I remember a speaker quoting a professor from the New York Theological Seminary: "Whatever gets your attention ultimately gets you". He was holding up the importance of directing our attention our focus, our thoughts to those things truly worthy of our attention, mindful that what we think about has a very powerful influence over our feelings, and ultimately even our actions. If we desire our actions to be Christ-like, we need to fill our minds with those thoughts that will produce such. Maybe that's another way of saying what the scriptures state, "We reap what we sow". Or to put it another way, "stinking thinking is likely to lead to stinking feelings and ultimately to stinking actions!".

The reality is: something is going to get our attention. An old adage from my childhood days cautions: "an idle mind is the devil's playground". The verse from Philippians would suggest by filling our mind with the right kind of things there will be little room for anything spiritually harmful.

VdC weekends model a healthy way to begin a day – focusing on God in worship. Some persons literally seek out an early morning worship experience on the way to work, others make an altar call on the way to work, and still other have their devotions during breakfast or while out jogging or walking. You'll be a healthier person for it!

Via de Cristo is an Ecumenical Movement, So What Does That Mean?

The Via de Cristo movement promotes the unity of the body of Christ. That unity is from Christ, not from us. We do not take away that unity by organizing into denominations, nor do we cause the unity by merging. Our unity exists because Jesus died for us and united us as one body of believers. Because of this, the National Lutheran Secretariat considers its weekends to be ecumenical. All who are baptized in Christ are welcome to participate in a Via de Cristo weekend. However, the Via de Cristo weekend is Lutheran in its theological and doctrinal content, style of worship and devotion. Christians from other denominations who participate in a Via de Cristo weekend are taking part in a Lutheran experience and no apologetic alterations in the weekend are made as a concession to the non-Lutheran participant. **†**

Criteria for Selection of Participants

The Via de Cristo is an instrument of renewal in which a specific method is developed. Through this method there is one objective: the Christian renewal of society.

The task of selecting participants is the greatest importance and consequence both for the effectiveness of the Via de Cristo and for the work towards the objective.

<u>The Via de Cristo is NOT</u> for everyone. Indiscriminate and haphazard distribution of applications is not desired. If you remember the rector at your Via de Cristo said, "It is not for children or fools." Although there may be authentic experiences of conversion that occur at Via de Cristo from time to time, the weekends are primarily for Christian renewal. Also the Via de Cristo is not a place to send people to solve their problems. It is in this area that the participant's pastor can give helpful direction.

The Via de Cristo must never be concerned primarily with increasing its membership rolls, but must see its role in building and renewing Christian Leaders, so that they might more effectively Christianize their environment. **†**

What Does De Colores Mean?

The first Cursillo was done on an open hillside in Spain in 1947. Following it, one of the participants saw a Rooster. As the story goes, it was a wonderful three days of getting closer to God. The whole group was full of love for God and each other.

This love made everything look more alive and yes, more beautiful. On the return trip,

their bus broke down and they waited in a farm yard where the colors of the Rooster seemed to jump out and demand recognition for the bird as one of God's beautiful creatures. Singing and shouting 'De Colores!' The Cursillistas began to rejoice again, praising God and rejoicing in the shining colors of a little Rooster. So, they wrote a song about it, and gained a theme song and mascot for what was to become the Cursillo movement.

The song they wrote is De Colores, which means "of many colors". Some say there are 70-100 verses to this song. This song is sung at nearly all Cursillos, and many other fourth day movements, with the most infamous verses being: Sings the Rooster; sings the Rooster with his quiri, quiri, quiri, quiri, quiri;

And the cluck hen; and the cluck hen with her cara, cara, cara, cara, cara:

> And the babe chicks; and the babe chicks with their pio, pio, pio, pio, pi.

Thinking back to the early days in Spain, and the people who came to participate in the Cursillo Movement, you will realize the value of the symbol of the Rooster and its beautiful

tail feathers. To the Spanish the Rooster was symbolic of the rainbow in the Old Testament where God makes a covenant with His People. Also, the Spanish, with much poverty following the war years of World War II, found the Rooster a symbol of wealth and prosperity, a status symbol in a rural farm area. Roosters are found wandering the roadways and hillsides all over Spain. And, a good Rooster and hen give promise of eggs and more chickens to come. Thus, the countryman has promise of food and a commodity to sell or trade to provide for his family and community. **†**

The rainbow colors of the tail feathers have a special and significant meaning to the Christian.

• **Green** denotes new life, growth, and God's beauty of nature that surrounds us. It symbolizes the ordinary times of the Church year.

• **Blue** denotes loyalty, our commitment to God and His people. It also denotes truth, justice, and the waters of our Baptism.

• **Purple** denotes our dying and rising again along with the suffering of Jesus Christ.

• Yellow and Orange hues denote warmth, light, promise. They remind us of the love of God's Son in our lives, the light of a candle, the rays of the sun, and the changing seasons.

• **Red** denotes celebration, joy, and confirmation. It is symbolic of our feast days within, the Church, Christmas Day, and Pentecost.
