Even if you are not on the team, you can be involved on the weekend. The team makes a financial commitment, sacrifices their time, and puts great efforts into preparation. The community at large can help with important tasks that make the weekend run smoothly and gives the team added support.

- 1.) Help with set-up. You can help team move all of the essential supplies into their appropriate places on Wednesday night.
- 2.) Make a donation. Contact the head cook to contribute food items needed for the weekend. Financial contributions can also be accepted toward food and supplies.
- 3.) Pray! Sign up on the prayer vigil list at www.3dayol.org
- 4.) Participate in the prayer chapel. Community are welcome to pray with the team in the chapel during rollos. Contact the head server to coordinate access to the building.
- 5.) Kitchen/dining room help. Contact the head server to make arrangements to help prepare a meal, wash dishes, set tables, etc. Many hands make light work.
- 6.) Write letters or contribute gifts of love. Hand written notes and

thoughtful gifts of love show grace to the participants.

Spiritual Director's Corner

I enjoy social media and, when it comes to the topic of prayer, I see two themes: we ask God to act in some way, and we speak of our gratitude for what God's done. There's a weird dynamic on the latter theme. It goes this way: "I'm not going to ask you for anything, God. I just want to say 'Thank you' for everything I have!"

It sounds thoughtful and pious, but it's small, like we're re-living the six days of Creation. Once the pieces of our lives are all or mostly or sufficiently in place, we sit back in God's presence and call pronounce it as "good." And feel pretty good about doing it.

But God continues to create. The world continues to change. And just like creation,



we are designed to grow and change, too. God desires our growth and change. In fact, the absence of growth and change is a certain sign of death. Is that theme of growth present in our prayer lives? Are we asking God to grow us? Are we actually seeking God-given growth? Christian leaders are ordinary people who let God grow them, who ask God to grow them. Without growth, Moses doesn't stand up to Pharaoh. Without growth, Joshua doesn't succeed in Canaan. Without growth, David never becomes king. Without growth, Peter doesn't share the Gospel with anyone but the Jews. Without growth, Paul doesn't teach effectively.

They were called to do great things, but they were not capable. Not on their own merits. Not until God grew them — and kept growing them. First and foremost, they grew through prayer. Worship and praise was important, yes, but prayer was essential. In fact, Moses was changed so mightily by his life of growing prayer, even his physical appearance was changed.

One of the prayers God is eager to answer is a request for personal growth that God would be glorified with our lives. It's

a bold and daring prayer: "Show me where I can grow, God, where I must grow — then grow me." Increase my faith. Show me how and where I can be more generous. Teach me to forgive. Strengthen me to be bolder. Teach me to love like Jesus. Make me restless on matters of injustice. Teach me to be less practical and more hopeful. Create in me a more reverent heart.

What would happen if you gave God a week? A month? A season? A year? Who would you be? A better question: Who does God desire you to be — and will you invite God to take you there?

Day visitors are welcome. A pot-luck supper will be held on Saturday evening.



When a new participant inquires about a reunion group, this list helps them find others in their area. As a community, it is imperative that we offer our support to everyone on their walk. Occasionally this may mean that some reunion groups add members, divide, or spend some time helping a new group get started. Palanca for weekends

Palanca from the community is encouraged every weekend.

- 1.) Please pray for the participants and team. Our greatest gift is to surround them with prayer.
- 2.) Writing letters for each participant offers our encouragement in a personal and profound way. Hand written letters are encouraged over mass-produced printouts. All letters should be turned in to the weekend by Saturday evening.
- 3.) Attend send-off, serenade, and clausura. Your presence shows support for the participants.
- 4.) Gifts of love may be given. If you choose this form of palanca, ensure that there is enough for everyone and bring it to the weekend ready to be distributed at an appropriate time. How do you select a participant?

The Via de Cristo is an instrument of renewal in which a specific method is developed. Through this method there is one objective: the Christian renewal of society.

The task of selecting participants is of greatest importance. How we select and invite individuals makes a difference in how the weekend flows and the impact Via de Cristo can have on the greater church.

The Via de Cristo is not for everyone. Inviting participants without careful thought, discernment, and prayer is not ide-

al. While Via de Cristo seeks to be inclusive, a blanket invitation in your congregation is not the most effective way to involve people in the movement. Individuals are not randomly pulled from the crowd. Instead, Christian leaders are called into an experience for growth. Although there may be authentic experiences of conversion that occur at Via de Cristo from time to time, these weekends are intended for Christian renewal. The Via de Cristo is not a place to send people to solve their problems. Often the participant's pastor can give helpful guidance. Via de Cristo makes the biggest difference when a participant is ready to receive the message and apply it to their life.

The Via de Cristo must never be concerned primarily with increasing its membership rolls, but must see its role in building and renewing Christian Leaders, so that they might more effectively transform their environments. The goal is to select those who are leaders and potential leaders, in order to equip them for the work of the church.

Before you sponsor a participant on a weekend, consider the check-list below to guide your discernment and invitation.

A Check-List for Sponsors

About the participant:

- Does he/she desire to grow as a Christian? ‰
- Have potential for leadership in his/her environment?
- Have the capacity for careful listening and understanding?
- Seriously open to change and spiritual growth?
- At least 18 years old, mature, responsible, and in good emotional health?
- Physically capable of fully participating in the weekend?
- Understand that Vía de Cristo is more than just attending a weekend?
- Really want to attend a weekend?
- At a relatively stable place in their life?

Before you invite someone to a weekend, use this checklist as a guide.

About you as a sponsor:

- Have you been living the fourth day and understand the goals of Vía de Cristo? %
- Prayed for guidance before taking action to sponsor this participant?
- Spoken to the participants pastor?‰
- Told the participant about the fourth day? ‰
- Ensured that he/she really wants to participate and is not just doing you a favor?
- Offered to assist the participant with baby/pet/house sitting, etc.?
- Offered the participant transportation to and from the weekend?
- Agree to support the participant through prayer, written palanca, and your presence at the sendoff and the closing?
- Agree to actively assist them join a reunion group?
- Agree to support the participant in their fourth day for at least six months after the weekend?
- Shared with them about the \$100 suggested donation that will be discussed at the end of the weekend?
