STAY CONNECTED WITH GN!VDC

You may have noticed that this newsletter is not at the "usual" time to receive mail from GNVDC. In order to keep our community better informed, we are transitioning to newsletters quarterly instead of the previous semi-annual format. The goal is to provide you with timely information on weekends, ultreyas, and other important issues within our community.

In order to stay even better connected to GNVDC on your fourth day, here are some other steps you can take to make sure you are receiving important communications from the secretariat and community:

- Sign up for a username on our website (www.gnvdc.org) This will give you access to details on the community section of the site. The guest login no longer works in order to maintain privacy for our users. Having your own login will be the only way to have online access to team and participant lists leading up to a weekend.
- Join our **email list**. Follow the link on the community section our website to receive periodic updates and information from the GNVDC community. This will connect you with our Constant Contact list. After you sign up you will need to confirm your email address to start receiving email.
- Update your information in our database. Once you have a username and password on our site, you can follow the link on the website to update your contact information. Email addresses and phone numbers often change. Your current information helps us to stay in touch.
- Connect with other members of the community on Facebook. Search for Good News! Via de Cristo to request membership in our group.

Sponsorship

There has been a growing trend in our community for the majority of our participants to be sponsored by the team members for that weekend, as people of our community are often waiting until they are called to a team to invite people to attend the Via de Cristo. Along with that trend, we have experienced a decline in the number of participants on our weekends, and worse, the cancellation of two men's weekends due to lack of registered participants. Sponsorship of participants for a weekend is one of the most significant ways that we can help to influence the world for Christ and serve this community, and is a role that each of us should be praying about.

Over the years, I have sponsored five participants; three of which I sponsored while on team, and two of which I sponsored when not serving. In my opinion, the experience was more meaningful for me and for my sponsored participant when I sponsored them while 'in the community'. Here are my observations:

- Palanca (prayer) is the foundation for the weekend. You will have more time to pray intentionally for your participant before, during, and even after the weekend if you are not on team and occupied with other things.
- You will be able to focus solely on your participant prior to sendoff, being completely present with them and attentive to their needs. Conversely, if you are serving on team without a participant, you can filly engage in the activities involved in your team position.
- The participant has more "emotional space" to engage freely in the movements of the weekend if their sponsor is not present. Not all participants need that space, but there are some who will have a better experience with it.

- There is a marked difference in the conversation on the car ride home after clausura. The conversations with those whom I have sponsored when not on team have been more animated, since the ride home is their first opportunity to share their experience with someone who was not there. This conversation with the sponsor can help to reinforce the message of the weekend for the participant. In my experience, there is less sharing when the weekend has been experienced together. **My** being exhausted after serving may have factored into this difference also!
- I have felt more connected to the community when serving as a sponsor on weekends when I have not been called to team.

Members of the community can, and should, be sponsoring participants when they are not serving on team. Our weekends need the entire community, not just team members, to be engaged in our weekends in order for them to be successful! The time to start praying about who to invite as participants for our upcoming Spring Weekend is **NOW**... while our new Rectors are praying about who to call to team!



Reunion Groups

Reunion groups are the backbone of the fourth day. Finding a group to meet with for encouragement, prayer, spiritual direction, friendship, and general support on your faith walk can make a big difference in your life. A list of reunion groups currently meeting is available from the post weekend chair (postweekendchair@gnvdc.org) As groups change disband, and form, you can help us by updating your information.

If you do not currently have a reunion group, prayerfully consider joining or starting one. The Holy Spirit often works through our personal relationships. A reunion group is one way to be open to the working of the Spirit in your life.

Keep in mind:

* Reunion groups usually are made up of 3-5 members. This allows ample time for everyone to share in about an hour. * Conversations focus on piety, study and action. Use the card you received on your weekend as a guide—but don't view it as a checklist. It is meant to help us see where we are active, and where our practices could use more growth.

* Not every member of a reunion group needs to have made a weekend. Any Christian friend can benefit from sharing in this kind of relationship. If you have a hard time finding a group, ask some friends from your church to start one. Maybe they'll make a weekend at a later date. Maybe not. For now focus on supporting each other.

* The term reunion group can seem cliquish to some folks. Call it a prayer group, an accountability group, or a Christian life group (especially if your meeting will show up on a church building use calendar.) Whatever you call it, the purpose of the group is still the same.

My rule of thumb is that if I hear what might be a call in more than one place, then maybe the call is from God and I would do well to listen to it.

Lord, make us to be bolder than the ones serving Satan. Protect us, lead us, and Lord may your will be done.
